JOB SPOTLIGHT...WHAT THEY DO?

A mushroom farm provides many job opportunities for the supervisor role. A supervisor on a mushroom farm could oversee mushroom growing, harvesting, post-harvest activities and other activities

The Mushroom Harvest Supervisor occupation, is an especially important role, which can provide progression opportunities for workers who may start out as entry-level harvesters. The work is conducted both in the office and on the farm floor.

A harvest supervisor provides workers with support, skills and tools they need in order to meet the farm's mushroom quality and production requirements. The harvest supervisor ensures harvesters receive appropriate training to perform their harvest duties. They monitor tools and equipment assuring the safe operating condition, and develop harvest standard operating procedures for the farm. They make sure quality and safety standards are consistently met.

QUALIFICATIONS & EXPERIENCE

- Eligible to work in Canada.
- Farm floor experience is important and preferred for this role.
- Experience in mushroom, horticulture and/or agriculture field.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Strong organizational, problem solving and attention to detail skills.

TRAINING

On-the-job training will be provided. All workers must adhere to safety and personal protective equipment (PPE) and other safety equipment policies. Examples of training supervisors can receive include: Orientation Training, Supervisory Training, Food Safety, WHMIS, Conduct Incident Response and Reporting, Emergency Response Plan, Return to Work and Disability Management, Ergonomic Policies, Workplace Violence, Harassment, Sexual Harassment and Bullying Policy, Health and Safety Policy. Could include various supervisory, employment and safety training courses as identified by the farm from time to time.
