JOB SPOTLIGHT...WHAT THEY DO?

People working in the packaging department weigh and sort mushrooms to customer specification for size and quality. On the farm, they wash, weigh and slice the harvested mushrooms making sure that the mushrooms are packaged and ready to be shipped to the customer. They keep their workstations and the surrounding area clean and free of debris.

The packaging occupation starts at the entry level and workers can progress to supervisory and management roles within this area of the farm.

QUALIFICATIONS & EXPERIENCE

Good hand-eye coordination, communication, and teamwork skills are needed. Previous experience packaging mushrooms is helpful.

- Eligible to work in Canada.
- No previous experience is needed.

TRAINING

Training will be provided. All workers must adhere to safety and personal protective equipment (PPE) and other safety equipment policies. Examples of training employees working in packaging can receive include: Orientation Training, Packaging Training, Food Safety, WHMIS, Incident Response and Reporting, Emergency Response Plan, Return to Work and Disability Management, Ergonomic Policies, Workplace Violence, Harassment, Sexual Harassment and Bullying Policy, Health and Safety Policy.
